AFRICAN LIONS AND MOUNTAIN LIONS

About African Lions and Mountain Lions

African lions and mountain lions are mammals.

Mountain lions and African lions have 4 legs, a long tail, sharp claws, and sharp teeth.



African lions and mountain lions are warm-blooded.

Lions are big cats.

African male lions have big, bushy manes. Manes help protect the lions when they fight.

Male mountain lions don't have a mane.



African lions can make a loud sound called a roar.

African lions are the only wild cats that live in family groups called a pride.

Baby lions are called cubs.

Mountain lions can climb trees.



Mountain lions and African lions sleep 18-20 hours.

African lions and mountain lions can run up to 50 miles (80 kilometers) per hour.

Mountain lions can jump up to 45 feet (13 meters).

African lions can jump up to 36 feet (11 meters).

African lions and mountain lions have predators. They are bears, hyenas, and wolves.

Mountain lions have gray or tan fur, and their chest and bellies are white.

African lions have yellowish brown fur to match the grass where they live.

There are many different animals that live in the same places as African lions: giraffes, buffaloes, elephants, rhinoceroses, deer, and zebras.

Female African lions are called lionesses.

Female mountain lions and African lions have a den, a safe place to hide behind the rocks or bushes.

There are 2 different types of mountain lions: they are called pumas and cougars.

Mountain lions adapt to 2 different climates: summer and winter. Mountain lions have thick fur that keeps them warm in the cold mountains. At the lower elevations, mountain lions stay cool under the shady trees.



Do African Lions and Mountain Lions Hibernate?

During the winter, African lions and mountain lions do not hibernate.

What do African Lions and Mountain Lions Eat?

African lions are carnivores. They like to eat zebra, birds, deer and giraffes. Mountain lions are also carnivores and they like to eat deer, elk, big horn sheep, raccoons, skunks and rabbits.

African lions and mountain lions eat 70 pound of meat a day.



Length and Weight

Male mountain lions can weigh between 110 to 180 pounds, and female mountain lions can weigh between 80 to 130 pounds.

Male African lions can weigh between 150 to 250 pounds and female African lions can weigh between 120 to 182 pounds.

Male African lions are 9 to 10 feet long.
Female African lions are 6 to 7 feet long.
Male mountain lions are 6 to 8 feet long.
Female mountain lions are 5 to 7 feet long.

Life Span

African lions can live between 10 to 14 years and mountain lions can live between 8 to 13 years in the wild.

Where do African Lions Live?



African lions live in Africa and India. They can be found in grasslands, tropical forests, and deserts.

Where do Mountain Lions Live?



Mountain lions live in North America and South America. They can be found living in mountains and forests.
