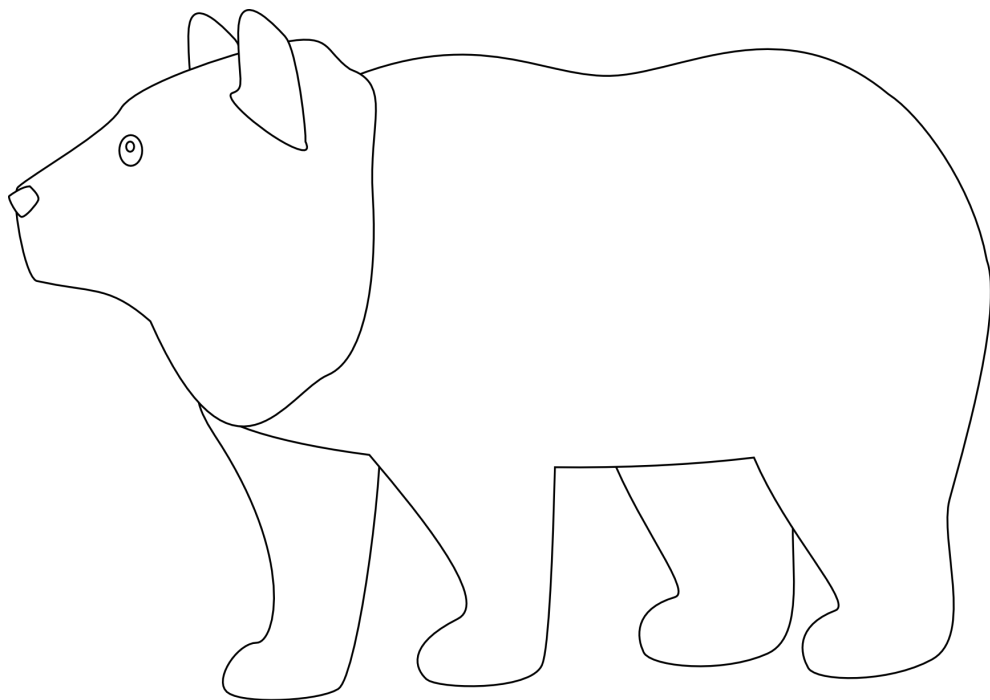

Grizzly bears are large animals.

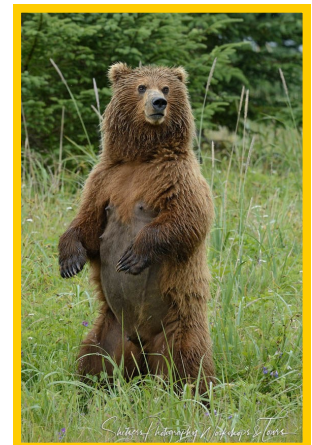
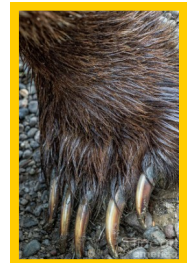
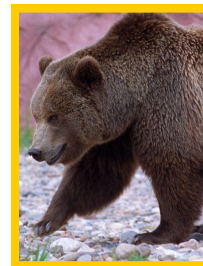
Grizzly bears can stand-up on 2 feet.

Grizzly bears can run faster than horses.

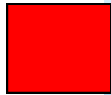

Where do Grizzly Bears Live?

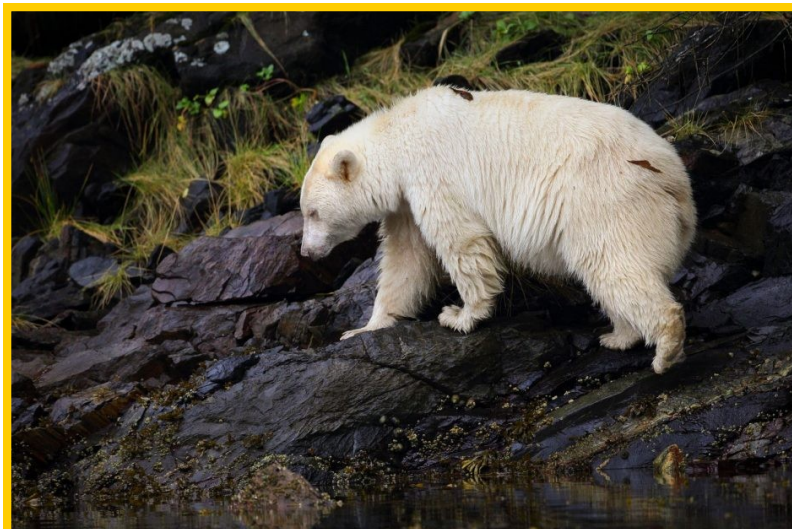
North America

Life Span?

Grizzly bears can live up to 25 years.

Heights and Weight

Male grizzly bears are 5 to 8 feet long and weigh between 350 to 800 pounds.

Female grizzly bears are smaller and weigh between 250 to 600 pounds.
